English

The English concentration provides a broad understanding of literature and cultivates skills in critical and creative writing. Students may choose one of two options within the English concentration: Literature or Creative Writing.

Concentration Requirements:

Option 1: Literature

The Literature option provides a broad background in British and American literature, some exposure to non-Western and diverse literatures, and training in the critical skill of reading, interpretation, and analysis.

- 4. demonstrate and understanding of literary criticism.

- 1. identify and demonstrate knowledge of various techniques of creative writing;
- 2. produce creative stories, poems, plays, or essays in the form, style, grammar, length, and writing level appropriate for the literary context.
