Commencement Ceremony Honors 2020 Graduates Virtually



In a year like no other, graduates, along with their friends and families, celebrated their new college degrees during a live streaming event prepared especially for this group of graduates. For the very first time, Charter Oak State College held a virtual commencement ceremony online honoring its graduating class. This 46th Commencement and first-ever virtual celebration honored the Class of 2020 with pre-recorded footage of speakers, students, and congratulatory messages from faculty and staff, along with the scrolling appearance of each graduate's name and degree.

Over 500 students were honored in a video designed to send well wishes and kudos during the ceremony hosted live on the College's YouTube channel on Thursday, August 27th at 3PM ET. The webcast remains on

www.CharterOak.edu/graduation for those graduates and families unable to attend the live streamed event.

College President Ed Klonoski addressed the graduates as well as Honorary Degree

Recipient, Wendy Garcia, Class of 2012 and Student Speaker, Tenell Rhodes, Sr. Both Mark Ojakian, President of the Connecticut State Colleges and Universities and Matt Fleury, Chair of the Connecticut Board of Regents

for Higher Education also offered prerecorded congratulatory messages to the graduates.

In his remarks, President Klonoski welcomed the viewing audience and congratulated the graduates acknowledging their hard work and completion of long-awaited dreams often delayed by false starts, work and family responsibilities. He commended them for their courage to try again, putting aside barriers that blocked their original degree efforts. He said, "to me, taking the risk to start again is far more interesting than the reasons why vou didn't finish the first time." He also acknowledged the COVID-19 outbreak and reminded the graduates that "facing these challenges and continuing to push forward and navigate in uncharted times, shows the true depth of your character and how resilient you are." He closed by applauding their courage and generosity and encouraged them to share their time, talent and knowledge with those around them.

He then verbally conferred all degrees and invited the graduates to move their tassels from right to left.

The student speaker was Tenelle Rhodes, Sr. Rhodes completed a Bachelor of Science in General Studies with a Concentration in Individualized Studies. He called the Class of 2020 'The Overcomers' and congratulated them on their ability to overcome unexpected obstacles and challenges including overcoming the Coronavirus Pandemic! He shared his 30 year journey and promise to his mother to earn a bachelor's degree and noted that everyone has had a different struggle, but that struggle is universal and he said "to keep going and be students of life and students for life."

The College Honorary Degree was awarded to Wendy Garcia, Class of 2012, who spoke of reaching a plateau in her career that required a bachelor's degree. She, like many Charter Oak graduates, attended college directly after high school but finally finished her degree at the age of 44. Garcia challenged the graduates "to brag about completing their degrees, that it takes hard work, dedication and commitment, and they



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THE PRESIDENT'S TAKE



Pandemic Musings

I write this latest contribution to Connections from home. All of Charter Oak's dedicated staff are providing support to our students, faculty, and each other from home. In March, the College saw the pandemic closure coming, and we experimented with our ability to work from home by closing the college buildings for two days. When we returned,

we had a chance to tweak our technology before the Governor ordered everyone home. The result of this preparation meant that we were ready to meet our students' needs without disruption. I am intensely proud of the staff for their perseverance over the past five months in the face of a variety of challenges from this virus, not the least of which is isolation from their friends and colleagues.

But that has not been the end of our challenges. As I write this, the state of Connecticut is struggling with massive power outages from the effects of a tropical storm that blasted the state several days ago. Many lost power and restoration may take over a week. Once again, the staff and faculty and, in this case many of our students, are struggling to keep operating without the technology tools they rely on. We have made allowances for students and faculty who have missed deadlines because of this crisis, and our staff is finding a way to keep the business of the College moving forward. I can tell you that I have never been more impressed with them (do you see a pattern here?).

And now, higher education is working to re-open their on-ground facilities to students, faculty, and staff. Charter Oak has created a re-opening plan, but it will be anchored on principles of safety first. We will bring back some volunteers into our buildings on rotating weeks. We will limit people to their week and to their assigned building to reduce the chance for exposure. Most of the staff will continue to work from home. Because we are an online college, our mission does not require that we bring everyone back onto campus, and that is a competitive advantage for us in this crisis.

So how is all this working? Our enrollment for our summer sessions was up 10%, and our enrollment for Fall is trending up by that same 10%. Our new graduate program – Health Informatics - has the class size it requires to launch. On that front, we are pleased to announce the development of the Health Sciences and Technology Department at COSC. This Department is a combination of current programs that overlap in curriculum and strategic goals. The programs include Bachelor of Health Care Administration, Bachelor of Health Information Management, Master of Health Care Administration, Master of Health Informatics. and associated certificate programs. This new structure will allow for continued opportunities in dual degrees and the potential for accelerated options. Having a single department will help to better align offerings, accreditation requirements, monitoring and reporting, and streamlined services. The directors of these programs were already working closely together to maintain a cohesive group of program offerings and it became clear that it would make sense to come together formally as a department with a shared strategic plan, shared goals, and a shared work team.

In short, Charter Oak is moving forward. In addition to our workforce degree programs, we believe that working adults will return to college for smaller credentials – certificates – to supplement their skills. To facilitate this need, we have applied for permission to offer financial aid for Medical Coding and for Speech and Language Pathology Studies. That aid will become available this Fall, and we plan to apply for financial aid for others this year. Once again, the College is working to meet our adult students where they need us. Low cost, online certificates offer our students a path forward within the workforce.

Finally, our Foundation launched a special program for students affected by COVID-19 called Charter Oak Cares. They are using the funds donated to offer our students immediate help with the costs of attendance. should be proud and stay humble!"

Dr. Shirley Adams, Provost of Charter Oak State College shared demographic facts about the Class of 2020, including that 70% were women; graduates ranged in age from 18 to 68, with the average age being 36; graduates hailed from 34 states and Canada with 66% from Connecticut; 42% earned honors; 18 graduated with a Master's degree, over 450 graduated with a Bachelor's degree, more than 50 graduated with an Associate's degree; 78% of Master's degree recipients

also earned a Bachelor's at Charter Oak previously, a third of graduates used multiple methods to earn college credit and most of the graduates earned their degrees while also working full time. The WIT and CT-WAGE special programs graduated seven students.

Graduates Damon DePaolo, Barkhamsted, CT, William McBriarty, Wallingford, CT and Francis Nerkowski, Clinton, CT all earned Awards for Outstanding Academic Performance.


