

## Foundation Awards Employer of the Year Award at Annual Breakfast

### 2020 and 2021 Golden Acorn Employer of the Year Award Winners Announced

The Charter Oak State College Foundation held its annual Employer Appreciation Breakfast in person on Thursday, November 18, 2021 at the TPC River Highlands Club House in Cromwell, CT. The event recognizes the economic and personal importance of employment opportunities that arise for the College's graduates.

"Charter Oak State College is dedicated to preparing our adult students for their next job. We sponsor an employers' breakfast to celebrate the supervisors and the companies that support our students. This event is a labor of love for us," said Ed Klonoski, President, Charter Oak State College.

The event highlighted the awarding of the Foundation's Golden Acorn Employer of the Year Award and winners for both 2020 and 2021 were recognized at the event as COVID-19 restrictions had made the in-person event impossible for the 2020 winner.

### 2020 Golden Acorn Employer of the Year winner was Russ Arnold, Director of Public Works/Town Engineer for the Town of Farmington; nominated by David Parent, 2021 COSC graduate.

Employer nominees were received from a wide range of industries and services across Connecticut and other states. Nominations were submitted by Charter Oak State College students and alumni in the fields of Public Safety, Early Childhood Education, Nursing and Health Care, Business, Paralegal, and Information Systems Studies representing many of the certificate and degree programs offered by the College.

Held annually, Charter Oak alumni and students are encouraged to bring their boss to breakfast – for free, and to nominate their boss for the Golden Acorn Employer of the Year Award. Founder of the Employer Appreciation Breakfast, Dave Calibey, Charter Oak State College Foundation Board Member and Big Thunk Principal explains, "We recognize that it is the employer that helps our adult students earn a living and expand their career opportunities - and for that the student (and we) are grateful. This year the Foundation honored the employers from both 2020 and 2021."

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## THE PRESIDENT'S TAKE



#### What's Next for Charter Oak?

This extended pandemic has been a real challenge to higher education, but I am pleased to report that Charter Oak is holding its own. In fact, I think we are doing a little better than that. Our enrollments have been stable, and we have increased our "savings." So we are ready to make some investments in our future.

Perhaps most importantly, the institution passed the academic torch from Dr. Shirley Adams to our new Provost Dr. David Ferreira. Shirley led our academic unit for nearly 20 years, and she moved us from having no residency requirements to our current cornerstone and capstone courses. She created the majors and the master's degrees we are offering. She was directly responsible for our transition into the online college we are today. Finding someone to fill her shoes was a real challenge, but I think we have done that.

Dave is continuing the program growth that is so important to our students and to our success. We just received Board of Regents approval for a new Bachelor of Social Work that will allow CT Community College associate grads to finish their degree with us at the same tuition they were paying at the Community College. We think this degree is going to be as popular as our RN/ADN to BSN bachelor's, which follows the same pattern. And on that front, we currently enroll 242 Tuition Match students. The Community College Tuition Match number continues to grow even as total community college enrollment drops.

We have also decided to move aggressively into the microcredential market. We are building credentials that are smaller than a bachelor's or master's, but have real workplace power. In each case, we are trying to make these new programs "stackable" to our bachelor's or master's degree programs. We think adults are looking for these faster credentialing opportunities, and we have purchased Credly as our badging platform. Dave is leading the CSCU micro-credentialing working group to ensure we collaborate as a system in defining and executing a micro-credentialing strategy in alignment with industry expectations outlined by CT Governor Ned Lamont's Workforce Council.

Also, on the workforce development front, we are working with the Governor's Workforce Council to assist with developing various solutions to Connecticut's workforce challenges. The goal here is to produce practical short-term online training that is built to industry specifications and delivered to those that need it at a price they can afford. Once these folks are employed, their employers would encourage their employees to continue with Charter Oak to pursue our certificate or degree programs.

These projects are on Dave's short list, but he has several that will take a little longer. We are planning to convert our Alternate Route to Certification program into a Master's in Education with teaching certification. He is also working to create two IT programs: Google IT User Support Specialist that can stack into a bachelor's degree in Software Development, Quality Assurance, and Testing. Both are partnerships between the College and Industry.

So things are humming here at Charter Oak. Our team has worked hard to keep us safe during the pandemic, and we are ready to break out and grow ourselves now that the worst finally seems to be over. Feel free to send a message to David at dferreira@charteroak.edu.

**NEW!** Last year, the Charter Oak State College Alumni Association began a new complimentary lunchtime series of professional and personal development discussions. Titled, "*Conversations With*," alumni of Charter Oak volunteered to share their knowledge, business experience, and insight via a virtual platform consisting of a twenty-minute presentation followed by a Q&A segment. The audience and presenters were from across the nation and the topics were a combination of personal and professional development.

John Thomas, Alumni Association President, stated "Any workshop or training that provides personal improvement or development tips is most definitely "professional development" as well. It is important to continuously learn and develop. However, it is equally important to share our expertise and insight with others. The Association is happy to provide this opportunity as part of our mission to create a connected Charter Oak community." The goal is to make a positive impact on career growth while also providing a unique benefit to our alumni. The idea was "born" from a conversation between Carol Hall (Associate Director of Development) and Charter Oak graduate, Damon DePaolo.

Damon is a Charter Oak Graduate, Lifetime Alumni Member, and the Director of Cyber Talent and Education Management for the Office of Cyber Security at MassMutual. He understood that many Charter Oak graduates have workforce experience, are taking courses to transition to a new career, and might need help defining their qualifications. He wanted to give back to his alma mater. The inaugural *Conversation*, held in August of 2021, was designed and presented by Damon. Attendees were provided with tips on how to interpret job postings through the lens of transferable skills. He helped Charter Oak graduates and students see themselves as "A Unique Valuable Asset."




## An Outdoor Celebration for the 2020 and 2021 Graduates!


