From the Desk of the Provost

I hope your semester is going well.

The move to the new Blackboard environment posed a number of challenges at the beginning of the semester. Hopefully, term two will have a smooth start.

I want to use my letter to you to talk about what makes a student successful in college, especially in an online environment. It is important that you log into your courses the first day of class. You are given the opportunity to check

course syllabi even before you register, and you are also given the opportunity to log into your courses four days before the courses actually begin. This gives you time to drop and add a course without financial penalty.

You are also given the opportunity to register at least a month or two in advance of the next term, which gives you the chance to purchase your textbooks on time and to be prepared to start class on day one. Yet, we find that a number of students, regardless of the day they register, wait until the last minute to order their books and then complain to the instructor and/or to the advisor that they didn't get their books in time so they are behind in their work. We also find that a number of students wait until the weekend of the first week of classes to log in and then complain that they missed assignments and received a zero, or that they had trouble logging in.

You need to remember that this is an online college, and as such, we can track all of your log-ins and all of your attempts. We also know if you contacted the help-desk. Remember that most of our courses are 8-weeks in length. That means that if you miss a day, it is like missing two days, and if you miss a week, it is like missing two weeks. And, of course, non-attendance does impact financial aid—you will often owe a significant amount of money back to the College.

We have data that shows that if you fall behind in the first week of your course, your success rate is significantly diminished. I know that you want to be successful and we want you to be successful, that starts with getting into your course on day one or before.

We have an online orientation that you should have completed before starting your first course. It is not mandatory, but it is highly recommended. It is available to you throughout your time at Charter Oak. Again, we have data that shows that the success rate is higher for those who use the orientation course. If you haven't taken it, you might want to.

We provide free online tutoring in a number of subject areas. Yet, too often, I receive a grade appeal from a student who has failed a course because of his/her writing or math ability. When I check with the tutoring center, the student has not used the free service.

Success in college begins with you, the student. We realize there are many demands on your time, but you would not have signed up for courses and spent the money if you did not feel that going to college was important. Success begins with you.

You Won't Be Invited Unless You Apply!

To apply, you must log into the **ACORN student portal** with your username/password. Select the "Application for Graduation" tab from the top menu bar. Then progress through to complete the application and pay the graduation fee. We only accept online graduation applications with payment for students seeking to apply for graduation.



Order your Cap and Gown by May 21, 2017

If you are planning to attend the graduation ceremony, commencement registration is required and is available on the **ACORN student portal**.

After completing the graduation application, return to the **ACORN student portal** and click on **Commencement 2017** on the left. Indicate on this form the number of guests (maximum of **FIVE)** who will attend and whether or not you will be attending the brunch.

After submitting the **Commencement 2017 Form,** you will receive an email with instructions to order your cap, gown, and tassel package. **You must order online by May 21, 2017.** Caps and gowns are mailed directly to students.

If you are planning to attend the ceremony and already own a black cap and gown, you must complete the **Commencement 2017 form** found on the **ACORN student portal.** You will then receive an email with the link to purchase a 2017 tassel.

Honor cords will be available in the Student Center before the ceremony for those receiving honors. Military cords (red, white, and blue) will be available for those who serve or have served in the military.

If enrolled in your final certificate course or within 6 credits of completing certificate requirements, you must complete a *Certificate Graduation Application*.



Criteria for Letters Confirming Your Graduation

We receive a number of requests from students asking that a letter be sent to a college or to an employer verifying the date of their graduation. We are more than happy to honor this request. However, you should <u>not</u> make the request unless the following criteria have <u>ALL</u> been met:

- 1. Your concentration has been approved.
- 2. You have submitted your graduation application and survey (see deadlines for submission).
- 3. You have completed <u>all</u> academic requirements (contact your academic counselor).
- 4. <u>All</u> of your transcripts have been <u>received</u> by Charter Oak.
- 5. <u>All</u> fees have been paid (including the graduation fee).
- 6. <u>All financial aid requirements</u> have been completed.

When you have met the above criteria, requests should be made in writing to the Associate Registrar, Paul Morganti, 55 Paul J. Manafort Drive, New Britain, CT 06053, or email

pmorganti@charteroak.edu. The request should include the name, title and address of the recipient.

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Blackboard Help

Blackboard

Charter Oak State College is pleased to announce the launch of its NEW Support service. These new services expand the availability of support to 24 hours per day, 365 days per year. We are including some helpful information below to help you understand how the service works and how to take advantage of it.

HOW DO I CONTACT THE SERVICE? There are numerous support channels to choose from. See below.

We have a new online support portal that serves as a gateway to the support service offering. The URL is <u>http://charteroak.edusupportcenter.com</u>. Here, you can search the Knowledge Base for answers to commonly asked questions. You can also connect with a support representative through several options. The live chat option allows you to get answers quickly, while submitting a ticket typically takes the least amount of your time. Of course, you can call us, too. The toll free number is: **844-889-9725**.

WHAT HOURS DOES THE SERVICE COVER? The service is available **24/7**, **365 days a year**. That's correct, you can contact us at any time, day or night. We understand that needing help doesn't have a schedule and we are ready to assist you when the need arises.

WHAT TYPE OF ISSUES DOES THE SERVICE TEAM SUPPORT? The help desk can provide technical assistance with password issues, accessing Blackboard as a student, setting up your course as an instructor or using your Charter Oak email, as well as many other technology issues.

Our professionally trained staff are experts in all recent Blackboard versions and service packs. The staff also receives ongoing education that keeps them ahead of the game regarding updates to the software and other common support issues. Each interaction comes with a follow-up case email that has a detailed description of your case, and what steps were taken to resolve your issue. In many scenarios, your case solution email will include step-by-step walk-through instructions that you can refer to later if needed. You don't always have to wait until something is "wrong." If you have questions about Blackboard and its functions or features, give us a call and we'll gladly field any questions you have, and offer advice on best practices.

HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE FOR THE SERVICE TEAM TO RESOLVE ISSUES? When using the real time chat feature or calling the toll free number, most common issues can be resolved within five to ten minutes. Of course, there are more complex issues that may take longer, but ultimately the goal is to help you move forward. If we need to take extra time to do so, then that's what we will do. Ticket submissions are typically resolved in about 24 hours, but this can vary depending on the time of year. During non-peak times, it's not unusual to see ticket resolutions in just a few short hours.

From the Office of Institutional Effectiveness

Charter Oak State College (COSC) has a long history of listening to its students and revising processes and services to meet current needs. Course Evaluation Survey Results Update

Students' overall ratings of their courses and instructors were positive this past Fall 2016 term: 83% of students rated the overall effectiveness of their instructor as "High" or "Very High," and 86% of students rated the overall effectiveness of their course as "High" or "Very High."

The Office of Institutional Effectiveness would like to thank students for continuing to make the online course evaluation system a success. The purpose of course evaluation at our institution is to provide:

1) information for the individual faculty member to use in assessing his/her instruction, 2) data that may assist in making curricular and course content decisions, 3) data that will assist in improving the online delivery system, and 4) the student body with a voice in developing and maintaining an effective faculty and curriculum.

2) the insights that students provide play a significant role in helping Charter Oak continue to enhance its courses while preserving the things that the school does best. We would like to remind students that the Office of Institutional Effectiveness will email links to the online course evaluation survey during the final weeks of instruction in each sub-term.

New Student Survey Results Update

Charter Oak State College is interested in a student's experience going through the admissions process and becoming a student. In the survey, students were asked to respond to questions regarding multiple office and online resources. Twenty-one questions were asked regarding experiences with the offices of admissions, financial aid, business, registrar, and academic counseling. Eight questions are asked regarding online resources and Blackboard.

The New Student Survey was sent out at the end of January 2017 and was open for one month. A total of 393 students were contacted for the survey and 63 students responded for a response rate of 16%. When asked if it was easy to contact COSC offices by phone or email, 88% of students who attempted to contact our offices agreed (10% responded neutrally). When asked if useful information was provided by COSC offices, 83% of students who contacted our offices agreed (14% responded neutrally). These two inquiries related to the Financial Aid Office, Business Office, Registrar's Office, and the Admissions and Academic Counselors separately. Email is the most frequently used form of contact between COSC students and staff.
