HONORING PRESIDENT KLONOSKI AND HIS 25 YEARS OF SERVICE TO CHARTER OAK STATE COLLEGE

Charter Oak State College's president is celebrating 25 years of service as the College is turning 50! Ed Klonoski joined Charter Oak at the turn of the century and embarked on a mission that would bring this College engine online and into the future.

Ed was thanked for his vision and commitment to higher education during his time at Charter Oak as he took the College from "degree aggregator" to a 100% online College with a diverse talent pool from across the country. Charter Oak State College was ahead of its time in 1973 with a vision to create a pathway for women returning to the workforce and needing credentials, and President Klonoski remains at the forefront of student and workforce needs.

Klonoski's vision was critical in 2020 as Charter Oak proved that it was the educational engine that could (and did) during the COVID-19 pandemic! The staff were prepared ahead of the stay-athome orders to work from home and seamlessly transitioned to remote workers for the required time. Charter Oak students stayed the course and continued to earn degrees and credentials.

Ed's vision and willingness to reach beyond traditional to serve our non-traditional student, for keeping ahead of the trends, and for leading Connecticut's all-online public college into this century, President Ed Klonoski was nominated by Carol Hall, Director of Alumni & Donor Relations for the Employer of the Year! Klonoski was honored to be recognized. He quickly assured the other nominees that he would not be winning, and jokingly added, he even paid for his own breakfast!

ALUMNI AMBASSADOR & ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

As a workforce college 18,000 graduates strong, celebrating 50 years of helping students achieve success, Klonoski and Hall paused to recognize one notable Alumna on her retirement from the workforce.

Nancy Martone, Charter Oak State College Class of 1996, was presented with an Alumni Ambassador & Achievement Award, for her 30-year career in the health care industry, for her leadership, support to her community, and also for the passion she displayed in referring students to Charter Oak!

A proud graduate, Nancy is proof that higher education credentials and degree completion are imperative factors for personal and professional achievement. Nancy was already in the workforce when her boss encouraged her to complete her degree and expand her knowledge around leadership. She had a wide range of training and college credits but no degree. She was also starting her family and working a full-time job, these alone made degree completion seem too big of a challenge. Nevertheless, her mother (and others) recommended Charter Oak!

After earning her B.S from Charter Oak State College she earned her Masters' Degree in Organizational Communication and holds a Senior Professional Human Resources certification.

Notably, Nancy began her 30-year career in the health care industry as a respiratory therapist. She then used a combination of learning and perseverance as she grew professionally. Her positions

spanned the healthcare industry including Quality and Risk, Care Management, Patient Relations and eventually Human Resources and Healthcare Operations. Half of her career, over 15 years, was spent in leadership roles. She is now the Vice President and Chief Administrative Officer for the Hospital for Speak Care in New Britain, Connecticut.

Nancy also had a family and raised her children during these years, she served her community, and refers many students to Charter Oak State College!

The program included heartfelt stories of transformation, perseverance, passion, and triumph.

Marissa Perez Cardona is committed to empowering the next generation by supporting college and career advancement opportunities for all. She provided the audience with a mesmerizing story of one child's beginnings that could have ended very differently.

Marissa was the first one in her family to achieve a college degree, graduating from the University of New Haven with a BA in Communications. She felt driven to find a career that would allow her to give back to her community and to help others achieve success. As the wife to Miguel Cardona, US Secretary of Education, she is passionate about empowering the next generation and encouraged all those in attendance to actively support others on their journey.

Mervin Alexander, Charter Oak Class of 2018, kicked off the program by delivering a passionate message about encouraging his cousin, a single working mother, to attend Charter Oak State College to complete her degree. He shared that Tamara was awarded a full scholarship by the Women in Transition Program and persevered through many long days and sleepless nights to finish her degree. Mervin shared that his cousin could not be with us today because of her job. However, she (and he) was very thankful to the foundation and generous donors who made it possible for Tamara to finish her degree. He also assured them that their generosity in supporting higher education has transformative powers not only on the students ...but he explained, "it also had a very motivating and positive impact on Tamara's daughter." The generational impact is priceless!

Mervin then went on to explain the reason for his passion surrounding Charter Oak State College, and the confidence (and promotion) he gained from completing his degree. He shared that the support and guidance he received from his boss, Paul Foody, of Waste Management, helped him to be triumphant. "I was inspired daily by my boss, by his upbeat nature, and the positive manner in which he led our team. Plus, Paul was positively engaged with me and supported my degree completion pursuit – for these reasons and more, I have committed myself to do better and to reach for more!"

Vice President of Strategic Business Solutions at Waste Management, Paul Foody explained why he supported the COSC Foundation. "Because of Mervin's passion for his alma mater and because of his dedication to our team, I was happy to attend this breakfast last year.
