



Award to Advance Academics

CHARTER OAK STATE COLLEGE FOUNDATION AWARDS \$90,000

The Charter Oak State College Foundation Board of Directors unanimously voted to award the College \$90,000 for the creation of a new academic degree program – the Bachelor of Science in Software Development as part of its ongoing efforts to support the College, and ultimately the students.

Foundation President, Joyce Petrella said, "The Foundation Board and I believe in this investment for the College's future. The continued demand for skilled software developers remains high. The College's innovative approach will enable Charter Oak's adult students to meet the demand - a great value for everyone."

The new degree program launched this fall, 2024. Charter Oak State College President Ed Klonoski explained,

Financial scholarships from the Charter Oak State College Foundation can be a critical component in helping students reach their educational goals. Now, our Foundation has extended their outreach by providing financial support to launch a new academic program."

Ed continued, "The Bachelor of Science in Software Development will graduate students in an in-demand career field and provide Connecticut employers with skilled employees who are ready to work. CARLO ESIDORE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP



Shea Lecture-Community Impact

The 2024-2025 Shea Lecture Series ~ Bridging the Divide

The Shea Lecture Endowment was established in 1987 upon the retirement of Dr. Bernard D. Shea, Charter Oak's first President. His generosity and that of his family created an Endowed Fund that is used to host lectures, equitable opportunities, to engage students and the community in lifelong learning.



Session 1: Bridging Perspectives: The Art of Civil Discourse

In response to growing national polarization, the Charter Oak State College Foundation Board, led by Executive Director Carol Hall, elevated the 2024/2025 Shea Lecture Series to strengthen civil discourse. The series featured dynamic, interactive sessions aimed at building the skills needed for respectful, thoughtful dialogue around challenging topics.

When hearing of this timely discussion, Dr. Shea's daughter, Jennifer noted:

Our program is proven, revered, holistic; it is a transformative force that adapts continually to meet the unique needs of working single mothers, enabling them to achieve their dreams of self-sufficiency through higher education.


Proven: As of June 2025, the WIT program boasts impressive results: 332 single moms earned 275 higher education credentials, 184 bachelor degrees, 80 associate degrees, and 11 certificates. The program continues to uphold an 80% retention rate as our working moms persist semester by semester. These achievements highlight the program's effectiveness in creating pathways to educational and career advancement.

Revered: The WIT Program is generously supported by a mix of community and private foundations, dedicated donors, and the very graduates whose lives have been transformed by WIT. This robust support system underscores the value of our mission and the trust invested in us by the community.

Holistic: The belief of empowering our WIT participants through more than just financial support! Offering a holistic range of services, including funding for tuition, fees, books, and vital technology access. Our dedicated academic coaching and tailored roadmaps help mothers navigate their educational journeys with confidence. Plus, we focus on personal and professional growth through engaging workshops and coaching sessions. To top it all off, we provide stipends to help bridge financial gaps when resources permit. Our WIT Program Director shares the "most rewarding part of being involved in the Women in Transition (WIT) program is seeing the joy on the faces of the single moms who overcame incredible barriers to get a college degree and realizing that the future has a positive outlook. The moms in the WIT program have had overwhelming life and financial obstacles preventing them from getting the education they need to be eligible for jobs that pay a livable wage.

They struggle knowing that they can't get out of the poverty cycle without getting the expensive college degree, which can look unattainable. The WIT program's mission is to remove those barriers so that the moms have a chance. With financial assistance for courses and materials (including computers, internet access), academic counseling and mentorship, and workshops to give these moms resources to better prepare for a successful life, I see an amazing transformation in these strong women. They stand taller, they smile more often, and they have the inner knowledge that they earned it with all their hard work.

I hope the pride and joy that I see on their faces is amazing and brings a tremendous feeling of gratitude to all the contributors who have made this possible."
